On Wednesday, March 15, 2023, at approximately 2110 hours, I (Patrolman Michael Slininger) was detailed to 93 North Main Street for a report of a female patient with possible stroke symptoms. Upon arrival (with my L3 body worn camera active), along with Ambulance 40 and Engine 40, we located the patient, Sapna Shashikant Patel. As the EMT's were evaluating Mrs. Patel, their carbon monoxide detector emitted a warning about the CO levels in the dwelling. Mrs. Patel was ultimately transported to Robert Wood Johnson Hospital for treatment. It should be noted that this building was currently housing thirty-three female work volunteers for the BAPS Temple (112 North Main Street). Engine 40 investigated and confirmed that there was in fact very high CO levels within the home. All occupants were evacuated immediately. During an investigation into the source of the CO leak, Engine 40 discovered numerous hazardous safety concerns in the dwelling. Specifically, it was observed that there were no CO detectors, not enough smoke detectors, and many points of egress were blocked. opened. As a result, there was only one working point of exit for the occupants.

PSEG was contacted and did respond to investigate, however it was determined that the building used propane, not natural gas, therefore PSEG could not take any action. It was determined that a PVC exhaust pipe for a hot water heater in the basement was loose, and was the likely cause for the high CO levels.

Notification was made to both Robbinsville Township Engineer Roger Fort and Fire Marshall Brian Marshall. Upon hearing the conditions of the building, Mr. Fort gave instructions to deny occupancy in the building until he was able to do an inspection the following day. After Engine 40 had been able to properly vent the building and the Carbon Monoxide was at a safe level, the residents were allowed to retrieve their necessary belongings, and were then relocated by BAPS representatives. Once the residents had all left, the building was secured and police tape was put across the doorways.

The following day, Township Engineer Fort did respond to the location to investigate. Upon his inspection, Mr. Fort posted the building as an Unsafe Structure/Immediate Hazard due to the unapproved boarding and various code violations.

No further action was taken by this officer.
